Oreo Cookie Balls

This is a wonderful recipe my sister-in-law shared with me. It is for a decadent, rich, no bake cookie that will become EVERYONE's favorite. It is quick and easy. Hope you like it!

Ingredients:

- 1 regular size Oreo Cookies (any flavor)
- 1 8oz package creme cheese
- 1 package white almond bark (or chocolate if you like)

Place your Oreo Cookies in a large plastic bag and, using a dough roller or similar object, crush your cookies very well and place them into a large bowl. You may want to do a few cookies at a time to make sure they are well crushed. If you prefer, you can use a food processor.

When you have all the cookies crushed and in the bowl, add the cream cheese and mix very well.

Line a cookie sheet with wax paper. Roll balls about 1 to 1 1/2 inches in diameter (bite size) out of the cookie mixture and lay them out on the wax paper. Chill for about an hour in refrigerator.

In a large microwave safe glass bowl place your White Almond Bark and microwave on high one minute at a time until all the bark is melted. Stir frequently. Dip chilled balls in the melted bark.

Place them back on the wax paper sheet and allow to harden. Store in air tight container.

Variations:

Mint Oreo's dipped in half green chocolate and have dark chocolate.

White Oreo's dipped in white chocolate rolled in shredded coconut.
